Three (3) women officers of the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service (TTPS) were promoted to the rank of Inspector in a brief ceremony on Thursday 10th February 2022 at the Police Headquarters, Port of Spain.

Receiving their letters of appointment, canes and new badges of rank were Woman Inspectors, Alicia Piggot and Mahalia Bacchus both of the Tobago Division, as well as Sharon Motilal of the Special Branch.

During the brief ceremony, Acting Commissioner of Police, Mc Donald Jacob congratulated the three women police officers, stating that the promotion will undoubtedly add to their sense of actualization which should be used to lift the organisation. He stressed the importance of middle management whose mandate is also to harness and ensure a greater degree of responsibility and accountability, particularly among junior ranks.

COUNTER TRAFFICKING UNIT CONTINUES SPECIAL TRAINING WITH COAST GUARD OFFICERS



The Ministry of National Security's Counter Trafficking Unit (CTU) continues to equip Coast Guard Officers with the necessary expertise for Effective Screening for Human Trafficking Indicators.

Two training sessions with approximately 38 specially identified officers were conducted this week on Wednesday 09 and Thursday 10 February, 2022 at the Heliport Base, Chaguaramas. The training sessions were focused on providing border officers with the necessary tools to conduct preliminary screening of nationals and non-nationals for indicators of Human Trafficking, in an effort to prevent and suppress Human Trafficking exercises at our nation's sea borders.

Giving feedback at one of the training sessions was Coast Guard Officer, Midshipman M. Lindsay who expressed that all agencies of National Security must be aware of the long term effects of Human Trafficking. He urged members of the public to come forward with the necessary information to assist law enforcement officers in the fight against human trafficking.

To date, the Counter Trafficking Unit has delivered training to over 380 Coast Guard Officers.

The training is being delivered by Director, Counter Trafficking Unit, Ms. Alana Wheeler; Superintendent of Police, Trinidad and Tobago Police Service, Mr. Michael Veronique; and Legal Officer, Trinidad and Tobago Police Service, Mr. Zaheer Ali.






TTPS GENDER-BASED-VIOLENCE UNIT RECEIVES DONATION OF COMPUTERS
