PREPARATION TIPS FOR THE 2022 RAINY SEASON



The 2022 Wet Season for Trinidad and Tobago has begun! The Trinidad and Tobago Meteorological Service (TTMS) predicts above average rainfall activity for the period, therefore, it is necessary that everyone *Get Ready and Stay Ready*, in order to protect life and property, by taking the following steps:

- Place important personal documents, valuables and vital medical supplies into a waterproof bag or container in an accessible location;
- Monitor weather conditions from official sources. Regularly visit the website and social media profiles of the TTMS and the Office of Disaster Preparedness and Management (ODPM) - www.metoffice.gov.tt and www.odpm.gov.tt, for weather forecasts, alerts, warnings and cancelations;

- Pre-position sandbags around your property, especially if your area or property has a history of flooding;
- If there are signs that flooding is about to occur near your property, move important items to a higher floor if possible;

VACCINATED

The Ministry of Health (MoH) wishes to advise of the following requirements for the administration of the paediatric Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine:

- All children, ages 5-11, are eligible to receive the paediatric Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine
- Children must be accompanied by their parent/guardian
- Parents/Guardians must walk with:
 - a form of Identification
 - proof of relationship to child (guardians only)
 - the birth certificate of the child/ward
