13 OFFICERS RECEIVE COMMENDATIONS

Recently, at a recognition ceremony held at the Police Administration Building in Port of Spain, the Executive of the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service (TTPS) recognised the hard work and dedication of thirteen (13) officers.



Instruments of appointment were administered to Sgts. Allison Joseph, Brian Daniel and Eric Knutt, in recognition of their promotion to the rank of Inspector. In addition, ten members of the Special Branch Unit were acknowledged for their extensive work that resulted in the historic seizure on January 25, 2022 of a large quantity of the drug Ketamine, valued at over TT\$8 million, and one man being charged.

In addressing the officers, Commissioner of Police, Mr. McDonald Jacob, stressed that although the work was part of their normal duties, this seizure was significant as it made an impact on transnational crime.
