SAFETY AND SECURITY PRIORITIZED IN 2023 NATIONAL BUDGET

The National Budget 2023 was presented by the Minister of Finance the Honourable Colm Imbert M.P. in the House of Representatives on Monday September 26, 2022. Minister Imbert announced an allocation of \$5.798 billion to the Ministry of National Security (MNS) and its Divisions, to finance recurrent expenditure and new projects. Here are the highlights, as it relates to the MNS:



Computerization and Digitization – Computerization of the MNS
Head Office as well as the Trinidad and Tobago Defence Force
(TTDF) to increase information collaboration, data availability,
management and analysis; upgrading the Integrated Ballistics
Identification System at the Trinidad and Tobago Forensic Science
Centre (TTFSC), aimed at improving examination of all
firearms-related evidence linked to crimes; advancing the
Automated Fingerprint Identification System for the Immigration
Division which will improve the border management system; and
expansion of the automated fingerprint system and biometric
system by the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service (TTPS).

- Construction of facilities and infrastructural upgrades across Divisions to provide a safe working environment for personnel and enable more efficient service delivery. These include upgrades to the power supply at Trinidad and Tobago Coast Guard (TTCG) facilities; improving base infrastructure at Trinidad and Tobago Regiment (TTR) camps at La Romain, Felicity and Forres Park; upgrade of TTPS Command Centres; as well as the expansion of the Police Academy.
 - Acquisition of additional assets –
 A programme of asset acquisitions has commenced to bring the TTPS vehicle fleet to optimum operating and response capability. Also, arrangements are being made for the purchase of specialized equipment for the TTCG, as well as vehicles and equipment for the TTDF.



The MNS continues to work with all stakeholders to address public safety needs and maintain the security of all in Trinidad and Tobago.

7,000 ILLEGAL GUNS TO BE DESTROYED



The Ministry of National Security; CARICOM Implementation Agency for Crime and Security (IMPACS); and the Mines Advisory Group (MAG) are working together to destroy seven thousand (7,000) illegal guns, seized by law enforcement agencies.

The exercise commenced on Monday September 26, 2022 at the Police Academy in St. James, Port of Spain, and will continue over the next four months.

Minister of National Security the Honourable Fitzgerald Hinds M.P. was invited for the ceremonial first cut of weapons. The Minister gave his support to the initiative, stating that the project is designed to destroy the firearms safely and prevent them from being used for nefarious activities.
