MNS PARTNERS WITH UNDP AND USAID ON CARISECURE 2.0 INITIATIVE



On October 11, 2022, Minister of National Security, the Honourable Fitzgerald Hinds M.P., hosted the ceremonial signing and official launch of the CARISECURE 2.0 Project, in collaboration with the Embassy of the United States of America, Port of Spain, United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and United Nations Development Programme (UNDP).

The CARISECURE 2.0 Project is a regional multi-country project sponsored by the United States Department of State (USDOS) through USAID, and will focus on Strengthening Evidence Based Decision Making for Citizen Security in the Caribbean.

Trinidad and Tobago would specifically benefit from this project by implementing and developing reduction initiatives for Trafficking in Persons (TIP) crimes, while bolstering state capacity to facilitate timely and effective prosecution.

In his keynote remarks, Minister Hinds emphasized that, "the Government of Trinidad and Tobago is dedicated to improving their USDOS Trafficking in Persons ranking, and is committed to building capacity to support the national response against human trafficking."

The CARISECURE 2.0 Project will take place over a period of three (3) years from 2022 to 2025.

NATIONAL STAKEHOLDERS PARTICIPATE IN COUNTERING VIOLENT EXTREMISM WORKSHOP



Local and international stakeholders met in Trinidad and Tobago on Thursday October 06, 2022 at a Workshop to share national, regional and international perspectives on 'Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism (P/CVE)'.

The Workshop was a collaborative initiative of the Ministry of National Security and the Delegation of the European Union to Trinidad and Tobago. It was facilitated by the Royal United Services Institute (RUSI), Europe.

Delivering Welcome Remarks at the Opening Ceremony held the HYATT Regency, Port of Spain, Minister of National Security, the Honourable Fitzgerald Hinds M.P., noted that Trinidad and Tobago's approach to preventing and countering violent extremism and terrorism, as outlined in the National Counter Terrorism Strategy, is rooted in the country's local legislative frameworks; the use of an integrated Whole-of-Government and Whole-of-Society Approach; strengthening partnerships with the various Government Ministries, as well as Civil Society; and deepening collaboration with international partners in the areas of intelligence, coordination and capacity building.

The Minister also said that the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago and particularly the Ministry of National Security remain deeply committed to building resilient communities, empowering and protecting our nation's youth and other vulnerable elements of society, providing alternatives to criminal and radical indoctrination.
