MINISTER OF NATIONAL SECURITY MEETS WITH REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL OFFICIALS FOLLOWING LAUNCH OF THE CARICOM CRIME GUN INTELLIGENCE UNIT

Port of Spain: On Monday November 14, 2022, Minister of National Security, the Honourable Fitzgerald Hinds M.P., received a courtesy call from officials of the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF); U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Homeland Security Investigations (HSI); U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP); and the CARICOM Implementation Agency for Crime and Security (IMPACS).

This visit followed the launch of the CARICOM Crime Gun Intelligence Unit (CGIU), held earlier in the day at the CARICOM Implementation Agency for Crime and Security Headquarters in Port of Spain.

Minister Hinds welcomed all officials present and noted Government's concern regarding recent increases in gun-related violence in Trinidad and Tobago. He expressed his appreciation for the work being done by the respective local, regional and international agencies, to combat the trafficking of arms and ammunition. The Minister gave the assurance of Government's commitment to treating with reducing gun-related crimes in the country, through an integrated approach by all law enforcement stakeholders; and encouraged additional initiatives aimed at making Trinidad and Tobago, and the wider Caribbean region, a safer place.

Executive Director, CARICOM IMPACS, Lieutenant Colonel Michael Jones, thanked the Government of Trinidad and Tobago for its continued support to CARICOM IMPACS over the years, and indicated that the CARICOM GCIU is one of four top priority areas identified by Member States for implementation.

Representatives of the ATF, HSI and CBP underscored the strong relationship that has been established with local law enforcement agencies, and expressed optimism that the collaborative efforts would lead to successful outcomes.

Also present at the courtesy call were Chief of Defence Staff, Air Vice Marshal Darryl Daniel along with Vice Chief of Defence Staff Brigadier General Dexter Francis and other representatives of the Trinidad and Tobago Defence Force;
