STATE AGENCIES PROVIDE RELIEF TO FLOOD VICTIMS



The Office of Disaster Preparedness and Management (ODPM), as the national disaster coordinating agency, continues to monitor and support response and recovery efforts as a result of the ongoing Adverse Weather conditions that this country experienced over the last week.

The ODPM is supporting the recovery efforts of the Ministry of Rural Development and Local Government and agencies of National Security that are working assiduously to bring relief to the citizens of Trinidad and Tobago.

The ODPM together with the Trinidad and Tobago Defence Force and the Trinidad and Tobago Fire Service have been working together in flood inundated areas to bring relief to citizens who have been severely affected. Exercises conducted this week included water rescue and extraction, provision of assistance to T&TEC personnel with the restoration of electricity, coordination and delivery of meals, water, flood relief supplies, as well as reconnaissance on the extent of flood impacts via boat.

The ODPM also worked with the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service and the Ministry of Works and Transport in road clearance and traffic diversion operations. This was needed after the occurrence of a number landslides along main roadways. Aerial reconnaissance to view impacted areas was also conducted with the assistance of the Trinidad and Tobago Air Guard.
