CTU RAISES HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS AMONG THE YOUTH

The Counter Trafficking Unit (CTU), in commemoration of Human Trafficking Prevention Month in January, held sensitization sessions with two (2) schools to raise awareness on child trafficking and to warn children and school teachers of the dangers associated with the crime.



On Wednesday January 25, 2023 an outreach session was held at the Penal Quinam Government Primary School with Infants 1 and 2, as well as students from Standards 1 to 5. On Monday January 30, 2023, a session was conducted at the Brazil RC Primary School with students from Standards 4 and 5.

The sessions covered a basic introduction to Human Trafficking, how students can safeguard themselves against Human Trafficking and the harmful reality of online grooming.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT **COVID-19 AND INFLUENZA VACCINATIONS**





- Can I get the COVID-19 vaccine and the Influenza vaccine at the same time? Persons should wait at least 2 weeks between taking the Influenza vaccine and the COVID-19 vaccine.
- How many COVID-19 Boosters do I need? The Ministry of Health recommends a programme of two (2) Covid-19 booster doses taken four (4) to six (6) months apart.
- What is the difference between Influenza and the Common Cold? The Influenza virus is more severe than the Common Cold and its onset is more abrupt. Signs and symptoms of the Influenza virus may include: fever, runny nose, cough, sore throat, headache, chills, body pain or muscle pains.
- 4 How often should the Influenza vaccine be taken? The Influenza vaccine should be taken once a year during the Influenza season. Members of the public are reminded that the Influenza season runs from October 2022 to May 2023.
- I recently contracted the COVID-19 virus. When can I get boosted?

 Under the WHO Emergency Use License (EUL), individuals who have previously been infected with COVID-19 are eligible to receive the vaccine, however, vaccination should occur 3 months after contracting the virus.
- Which vaccine should I take? Both the Johnson & Johnson and the Sinopharm COVID-19 vaccines are acceptable for use as a booster dose for all Emergency Use License (EUL) approved vaccines.
- What should I bring / do on the day of receiving the vaccine? On the day of vaccination persons should:
 - Have a good meal
 - Refrain from consuming alcoholic beverages
 - Wear clothing that will provide easy access to the upper arm for vaccination
 - Bring to the facility your vaccination card and a valid form of identification (e.g. Driver's Permit, National Identification, Passport)
- 8 Why should I get the COVID-19 and Influenza vaccines now? By getting vaccinated for COVID-19, you are reducing your risk of disease, hospitalization, severe complications, and even death due to COVID-19, for both you and your loved ones.

Getting the Influenza vaccine can help protect you from getting the Influenza Virus and spreading it to others. The Influenza Vaccine can also reduce the severity of Influenza symptoms, if they do occur.
