FIRE PREVENTION TIPS

The fire season in Trinidad and Tobago is from December 01st to June 30th. The dry season, which runs from January to May, is the period during which time most bush fires occur. Bush fires place people and property at serious risk and can originate from both human activity and natural causes (sun rays).



Here are some handy bits of advice on how you can prevent bush fires in your area:

- Do not set outdoor fires during the dry season without first obtaining a valid Fire Permit from a fire station near you. This is in accordance with the Agricultural Fires Act Chapter 63:02 Section 18. If a permit is granted, guidelines will be provided by Fire Guardians which should be adhered to during the period specified on the permit.
- Keep houses and surroundings clear of combustibles (fire hazard items) at all times.
- Do not discard lighted cigarette butts or matches. Ensure that they are properly extinguished and disposed of in an approved manner.
- Do not burn items/vegetation/garbage in large heaps. It is more appropriate to burn items in smaller heaps or in barrels. Never leave garbage heap fires or agricultural fires unattended.
- Construct and maintain a fire trace {at least ten (10) feet} around homes which are close to open lots or wooded areas.
- If a fire occurs, even if small, call the Fire Service immediately at 990.
