MINISTER HINDS VISITS THE ROSE HILL COMMUNITY



On Thursday 3rd November 2022, Minister of National Security the Honourable Fitzgerald Hinds MP visited the Rose Hill RC Primary School and the Rose Hill community to get a first-hand look at law enforcement efforts transpiring on the ground, to curtail the ongoing gang and gun-related violence in the community.

On Monday, the Rose Hill RC School was caught in the middle of an exchange of gunfire that was caught on camera. Since then the school has been closed and online classes have been taking place.

Minister Hinds visited the school alongside Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP), Earla Christoper of the Trinidad and Tobago Police Service and Lieutenant Colonel Singh of the Trinidad and Tobago Defence Force and held discussions with the Catholic Education Board Manager, Mr. Sterling Jacob of the Rose Hill RC School.
