STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES LAUNCHED FOR COUNTER TRAFFICKING UNIT



On Thursday 03 August, 2023 the Ministry of National Security in collaboration with the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), launched Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for the Counter Trafficking Unit (CTU) at the Hilton Trinidad Hotel and Conference Centre.

The SOP is an outcome of Trinidad and Tobago's participation in an initiative implemented by the UNODC called TACK4TIP: Transforming Alerts into Criminal Justice Responses to Human Trafficking within Migration Flows. It provides a standardized framework for outlining step-by-step guidelines for the CTU's operations when a trafficking case is potentially identified.

Delivering remarks, Minister of National Security the Honourable Fitzgerald Hinds M.P. reaffirmed the country's commitment to combatting the scourge of trafficking in persons in all forms and highlighted how critical international partners are to national efforts against trafficking in persons.

DEFENCE FORCE PARTICIPATES IN EXERCISE TRADEWINDS 2023





A Trinidad and Tobago Defence Force (TTDF) contingent participated in recently concluded Exercise Tradewinds 2023, held in Guyana from July 14-28, 2023. In its 38th iteration, Tradewinds 2023 is a Caribbean-focused multi-dimensional exercise conducted in the ground, air, sea, and cyber domains and aims to bring together both Officers and other Ranks of allied nations, to act as a Joint Task Force to aid a host nation in a crisis event.

The TTDF contingent participated in many facets of the exercise including riot control, Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) and Jungle survival training.

Participating countries included Antigua and Barbuda, Bahamas, Belize, Bermuda, Brazil, Canada, Colombia, Dominica, Dominican Republic, France, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, Mexico, St. Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago, the United Kingdom, and the United States.
