Summary

The Director will establish and maintain relationships with key key international partners i.e. IADB, Cure Violence Global and local Civil Society and Corporate stakeholders and relevant partner ministries i.e. Education, Youth and Sport, Community Development, Social Development and Family Services, Health inter Alia to achieve the programmes goals and objectives.

## Duties and Responsibilities :

- Report to the Permanent Secretary or their designate and keep him/her informed of all relevant Unit activities inter alia as directed in addition to submitting monthly reports outlining all activities pertinent to the programme's outputs and impact or as otherwise directed.
